Tip Sheet for Parents from "Lily Makes Friends" by Patience Domowski, LCSW

Parents:

- Encourage your kids to talk to others, join in recess games and activities, join clubs/sports, and invite others to play with them
- Support and suggest to your child to initiate and invite others to talk, play, and come over (or go out somewhere if the house isn't suitable).
- Point out to your child they should try to match their behavior to those in the room and show them how.
- Have your child watch others interacting and point out the good and problem behaviors.
- Review after a problem situation with your child on how to interact better next time.
- Role play before a situation on how to talk to someone, ask them to play, or invite someone to an event.
